

Focus: although, though, even though, subject + verb clauses, in spite of, despite, noun/pronoun phrases, gerund (-ing) patterns, although vs. because, in spite of vs. because of

In English, we use specific words to connect two contrasting ideas—when the result is unexpected or surprising. The grammar changes depending on which connector you use.

1. Connectors followed by a Clause (Subject + Verb)

These words are followed by a full sentence structure (Subject + Verb).

- **Although / Even though / Though**
 - **Structure:** Connector + Subject + Verb
 - **Usage:**
 - **Although:** Standard and common.
 - **Even though:** Stronger, more emphatic contrast.
 - **Though:** Informal. Can be used at the end of a sentence in spoken English.

- *Although it rained, we enjoyed the picnic.*
- *Even though I was tired, I finished the report.*
- *I didn't get the job, though. (Informal/End position)*

2. Connectors followed by a Noun or Gerund (-ing)

These words act like prepositions. They are **never** followed directly by a subject + verb.

- **Despite / In spite of**
 - **Structure A:** Connector + Noun / Pronoun
 - **Structure B:** Connector + Verb-ing (Gerund)
 - **Structure C:** Connector + the fact that + Subject + Verb (Complex)

- *Despite the rain, we went out. (Noun)*
- *In spite of being tired, he kept driving. (Gerund)*
- **WARNING:** Do not say "Despite of". Do not say "In spite".
- *Correct: Despite the problem. / In spite of the problem.*

3. Contrast vs. Cause (The Logic Check)

It is easy to confuse **Contrast** (unexpected result) with **Cause** (logical result).

Type	Connectors	Logic	Example
Contrast	Although, Despite, In spite of	Unexpected Result	He bought the car although it was expensive. (Surprise!)
Cause	Because, Because of	Logical Result	He didn't buy the car because it was expensive. (Logic)

- **Because** + Subject + Verb
- **Because of** + Noun / Verb-ing
