

**Focus: no + noun usage, none as a standalone pronoun, none of + plural/pronoun structures, Usage at the start of sentences, Usage after 'be' and 'have', Forming short answers to questions, Transforming 'no' to 'not + any', Transforming 'nothing' to 'not + anything', Avoiding double negatives, Using they/them/their with nobody/no-one**

## 1. No vs. Not ... Any

We use **no** and **any** to talk about quantity or absence. They are determiner structures that often have the same meaning but different grammar.

- **Structure A (Positive Verb + No):** Use **no** with a noun and a positive verb.
  - Example: "I **have no** money." (More emphatic)
  - Example: "There **is no** milk in the fridge."
- **Structure B (Negative Verb + Any):** Use **not** (n't) with the verb and **any** with the noun.
  - Example: "I **don't have any** money."
  - Example: "There **isn't any** milk in the fridge."

**Rule:** Never use *no* with a negative verb (Double Negative).

- *Incorrect:* I don't have no time.
- *Correct:* I have **no** time OR I **don't** have **any** time.

## 2. None and None of

- **None (Standalone Pronoun):** used without a noun. It often acts as a short answer.
  - Q: "How much coffee is left?"
  - A: "**None.**" (NOT: *No.*)
- **None of + Determiner + Noun/Pronoun:**
  - Example: "**None of the** students passed the test."
  - Example: "**None of us** wanted to leave."
  - *Note:* When *None of* is the subject, the verb can be singular (formal) or plural (informal). "None of them **is/are** coming."

## 3. Negative Compounds (Nothing, Nobody, Nowhere)

These words follow the same rules as *no* vs. *any*.

Category	Positive Verb + Negative Word	Negative Verb + Any- Word
Things	I saw <b>nothing</b> .	I <b>didn't</b> see <b>anything</b> .
People	<b>Nobody</b> came.	<b>Nobody didn't</b> come (Incorrect).
Places	They went <b>nowhere</b> .	They <b>didn't</b> go <b>anywhere</b> .

## 4. Special Rules

- **Subject Agreement:** *Nobody/No one* takes a **singular** verb.
  - Example: "Nobody **is** listening." (NOT: *are listening*)
- **Pronoun Reference:** When referring back to *nobody/no one/everybody*, use **they/them/their**.
  - Example: "Nobody called, did **they**?"
  - Example: "No one lost **their** ticket."
- **Any- for Indifference:** *Any* can mean "it doesn't matter which."
  - Example: "You can sit **anywhere**." (It doesn't matter where).
  - Example: "Call me **any** time."
