The Changing Family

INSTRUCTIONAL PROCEDURE

- 1. Pre-reading (10 mins):** Direct students to the image prompt. Ask them to describe the "vibe" of the family. Use a digital whiteboard (like Jamboard or Padlet) to brainstorm words related to "Family" (e.g., stress, love, cooking, help).
- 2. Reading & Chunked Tasks (20 mins):**
 - Have students read the first paragraph silently. Ask: "Is social media good or bad for parents?"
 - Read the second paragraph aloud. Explain the metaphor of a "sandwich" (the bread represents the two generations being cared for, the person in the middle is the filling).
- 3. Post-Reading & QAR Discussion (15 mins):**
 - Break students into small groups to answer the "Author and You" questions.
 - Encourage them to share cultural differences in how their home countries view elder care versus childcare.
 - Review the Glossary words by asking students to create one original sentence for each word.
