- Narrative Tenses (Past Simple vs. Past Continuous)

INSTRUCTIONAL PROCEDURE

1. **Pre-reading (10 mins):** Display the image prompt. Ask students to describe the mood. Ask: "Why do people share stories in public?"
2. **Reading & Chunked Tasks (20 mins):**
 - Have students read the text once silently.
 - Second Reading: Ask students to underline verbs in the *Past Continuous* (e.g., *was working, were performing*) to see how they set the scene for the *Past Simple* actions.
3. **Post-Reading & QAR Discussion (15 mins):**
 - Review the QAR answers.
 - Focus specifically on the "Author and You" section to bridge the text with the students' own lived experiences. If students are comfortable, allow them to share the "memory" they would write about.
